**Trinity's Samaritans at work** - Early on April 6<sup>th</sup>, I received Basket of Hope\* requests from Ronald McDonald House (RMH) for two Korean children who had been injured in an automobile accident over the past weekend. Before I had the baskets assembled I received a call from the Director of RMH that went something like this "Addie, aren't you Lutheran? The father of the children that you are doing the baskets for is a student at the Lutheran Seminary in Fort Wayne, Indiana. This was a terrible accident – the wife and the five year old boy are in ICU units on ventilators, the twelve year old girl has a broken femur and the father has been released but has his right arm in a sling and right leg in a boot. The family had driven to Springfield to see the Lincoln sites and had the accident on the way back to Fort Wayne between Springfield and Decatur the evening of April 4<sup>th</sup>. Can Basket of Hope do more?"

I hesitated for a minute, said a short prayer and called Pastor Radtke because I thought this family might need more than a lay person like myself and Basket of Hope could provide. Remember this was Holy Week – many services and so the Pastors had very tight schedules. But within the hour Pastor Schnelle joined me at RMH and talked to the father, Mr. Park. Both of our pastors visited with the family during the weeks ahead. After the children were released from the hospital, RMH called to say that the father had to go into the hospital for surgery on his arm and RMH volunteers and staff do not babysit. In addition, Mr. Park was going to have to be in the hospital overnight. One call to a member of Trinity's Building Caring Relationships Team and within a few hours we had gals who went to RMH to sit with the children, help with their meals and meet their entertainment needs.

As the days progressed and the wife/mother continued to be in the hospital for rehab, etc., Principal Rodgers and Trinity mom, Tiffany Whitaker lined up rides from Trinity parents and teachers so the children could attend our school and learning center. Although the family has been told that the mother should be released before the first of June, arrangements have been made for the five year old boy, Joshua, to stay in our Learning Center, and the twelve year old girl, Ye Yong, to attend Lutheran High's Summer Camp. In addition to our local church involvement I learned that students from Fort Wayne had driven here on the Saturday following the accident to be with Mr. Park. Then during that first week while I was at RMH I met the Dean of Students from Concordia Seminary, Fort Wayne, who had come to help with some paper work related to the car and insurance.

Yes, I am very proud to be a part of such a group of children of God who don't hesitate to do for others. I thank God for all that Trinity and our church at large has provided for us and for those who serve so unconditionally.

**Are you Up to the Challenge? You can help Christ Lutheran Church of the Deaf Jacksonville.** In January, the parsonage (unoccupied and connected to the church) was severely damaged by broken water pipes. The Central Illinois Board of Directors has authorized tearing down the parsonage (completed the first part of June) and building a new 1,300 square foot Outreach Center in its place. This new Outreach Center will give Christ Deaf a modern facility for regional training of deaf leaders and for congregational outreach events. Their present single non-handicap-accessible restroom will be replaced by two family restrooms. The meeting room and office will be wired for computer networking, live-streamed events, and video capture/production. Their goal is to bring the gospel to the deaf and to gather the deaf together in the church. Christ Deaf's objectives include:

- [1] Hold spring and fall deaf retreats;
- [2] Conduct one annual regional lay-leader training at their site in Jacksonville and at other sites in the state of Illinois;
- [3] Conduct one annual deaf ministry introduction workshop (for hearing congregations involved in deaf ministry) at their site and at other sites in Illinois;
- [4] Sponsor local deaf events at least quarterly at their site in Jacksonville;
- [5] Conduct a weekly outreach to the students of the Illinois School for the Deaf through their Good News programs.

The Central Illinois District Church Extension Fund has offered a challenge grant of \$10,000.

They are challenging us to raise \$10,000, then CEF will match it. Can you help us meet our goal? Send your gift to:

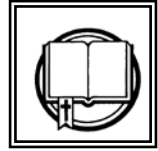

Mark 5:22-34, 39-42

***<sup>22</sup>Then came one of the rulers of the synagogue, Jairus by name, and seeing him, he fell at his feet <sup>23</sup>and implored him earnestly, saying, "My little daughter is at the point of death. Come and lay your hands on her, so that she may be made well and live." <sup>24</sup>And he went with him. And a great crowd followed him and thronged about him. <sup>25</sup>And there was a woman who had had a discharge of blood for twelve years, <sup>26</sup>and who had suffered much under many physicians, and had spent all that she had, and was no better but rather grew worse. <sup>27</sup>She had heard the reports about Jesus and came up behind him in the crowd and touched his garment. <sup>28</sup>For she said, "If I touch even his garments, I will be made well." <sup>29</sup>And immediately the flow of blood dried up, and she felt in her body that she was healed of her disease. <sup>30</sup>And Jesus, perceiving in himself that power had gone out from him, immediately turned about in the crowd and said, "Who touched my garments?" <sup>31</sup>And his disciples said to him, "You see the crowd pressing around you, and yet you say, 'Who touched me?'" <sup>32</sup>And he looked around to see who had done it. <sup>33</sup>But the woman, knowing what had happened to her, came in fear and trembling and fell down before him and told him the whole truth. <sup>34</sup>And he said to her, "Daughter, your faith has made you well; go in peace, and be healed of your disease." ... <sup>39</sup>And when he had entered, he said to them, "Why are you making a commotion and weeping? The child is not dead but sleeping." <sup>40</sup>And they laughed at him. But he put them all outside and took the child's father and mother and those who were with him and went in where the child was. <sup>41</sup>Taking her by the hand he said to her, "Talitha cumi," which means, "Little girl, I say to you, arise." <sup>42</sup>And immediately the girl got up and began walking (for she was twelve years of age), and they were immediately overcome with amazement.***
